


SBIRT *in* Colorado

Screening, Brief Intervention, and Referral to Treatment is an evidence-based early intervention technique to prevent, identify, and reduce use of alcohol and other substances in adults and adolescents. SBI is recommended by the CDC, U.S. Preventive Services Task Force, American Academy of Pediatrics, SAMHSA, and the Veterans Administration. As a program of Peer Assistance Services, Inc., the goal of SBIRT *in* Colorado is to support screening as a standard of care throughout Colorado's health care systems.


Online SBIRT Training

PAS offers no-cost online training, in partnership with Kognito Solutions, by using digital avatars. To date, there have been 1,054 unique users.


Technical Assistance
